8.* Motion (Measures by the County Government to Regulate Milk Trading Business)

THAT, aware that trade development and regulation and agriculture, including animal husbandry, are devolved functions under part 2 of the Fourth Schedule of the Constitution of Kenya 2010; also aware that most farmers in Bomet County do dairy farming; also aware that the County Government and other private entities have established milk cooling plants as milk collection and buying centres to assist dairy farmers across the county; further aware that this arrangement do avail numerous benefits to farmers such as regular income, access to credit from financial institutions as well National Health Insurance Fund (NHIF) medical cover amongst others; deeply concerned that farmers have resorted to selling their milk to middlemen at throw away prices which is hurting the dairy industry in the county; this Assembly urges the County Government to consider appropriate measures including regulating milk trading businesses and ensuring that farmers deliver their milk to the cooling plants across the County so as to strengthen the dairy industry within the county.

 - v. Whether the health facilities have the requisite vaccines, medicines and other necessary supplies.
